

Ohhh... Mr. Chung:

Dashes:

Mr. Chung—a funny man—lives in Hong Kong.

Comma splice:

Mr. Chung, a funny man, lives in Hong Kong.

Parenthesis:

Mr. Chung (a funny man) lives in Hong Kong.

1 dash:

I like Mr. Chung—a funny man from Hong Kong.

1 comma:

I like Mr. Chung, a funny man from Hong Kong.

Prepostional phrase: (of, with, in)

Mr. Chung of Hong Kong is a funny man.

Mr. Chung with dark hair is from Hong Kong.

The bus in Hong Kong travels down the street.

The Pigs rule:

Plural subject-singular verb (P-S) The <u>pigs run</u> in the pen. or Singular subject-plural verb (S-P) The <u>pig runs</u> in the pen.

Combine Mr. Chung with the Pigs rule:

The <u>pig with a pink tail makes</u> a mess when <u>it eats</u>.

The <u>pigs with pink tails make</u> a mess when <u>they eat</u>.

Noun is plural so verb will be singular.

Ex: The <u>trees</u> in the countryside <u>look</u> dry.
